

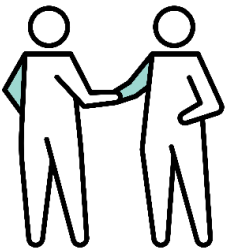
NDIS Audit Participation Information – Easy read



As part of the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS), we must have an external Audit so that we can provide services.



Auditors come to talk to us, and look at the work we do with people.



Auditors would also like to talk to you to see if you're happy with the services we provide you.



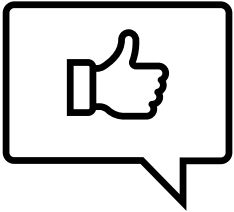
You can have a person you choose to support you if you want to talk with the auditors.



The auditors would like to know about the services we provide you by looking at files that include information about you.



The auditors write a report about our services which goes to the NDIS Commission. No personal information about you is in the report.



We will contact you to get your consent when it is time to talk with an auditor and let them look at your files. You can also talk to us if you need more information.



If you don't want to talk to the auditors or have them look at your files that's OK, you don't have to.

Key words explained:

Auditor – a person who checks the work that we do.

External Audit – When the work Spectrum Centre does is checked by an auditor to make sure we are giving a good service.
